Lethal Means



Firearms are the most lethal means; 90% of those who use a firearm die



Males more likely to use firearms

Females more likely to use self-poisoning



Most firearm deaths are suicides followed by homicides and accidents (2%)




Demographics

Male suicide rate is roughly 4x higher



The majority of suicides are between ages 25-64



Rural suicide rates are slightly higher than urban




Most suicides are among White Missourians




Highest numbers in St. Louis Metro and Kansas City

- ### Top 3 Barriers to Seeking Help
- Among suicidal college students
- × "I do not think I need any assistance" (42%)
 - × "I feel shame" (41%)
 - × "I am afraid that people will judge me" (35%)

51% of college students were "Very Likely" to refer someone who says they are thinking about suicide to a local resource




However...

only 21% of college students were "Very Likely" to bring up the topic of suicide with someone they think is at risk

Veterans



Missouri veteran suicide rates are nearly three times higher than US general population

Highest suicide rates were among young veterans

16% of all suicides in 2018 were veteran suicides
